

Made from just one mini-charm pack, and a little background fabric, these easy to piece ears of wheat, make a lovely pillow, or quilt block for your harvest home xx

# To make the panel you'll need:

- 1 mini-charm pack 101 Maple Street mini-charm is used in pics throughout. Or a Cozy Up mini-charm would also work well.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip low volume fabric Cut into (11) 2 ½" squares
- (2) 1" strip Off-white MBS 9900 20 Cut into (48) 1" squares
- Threads for piecing and quilting.

# If making into a pillow you'll also need:

- 1 FQ of Essex Linen (25" x 20") for border and backing
- 18" x 25" Wadding
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding

Equipment: Rotary cutter, ruler and mat; Sewing machine; Iron and ironing board; Scissors; Pencil or water erasable marker.









## To make the panel:

- 1. On each 1" white square, draw a diagonal line.
- 2. From the mini-charm pack, select 24 colourful squares. Divide in to 3 groups of 8
- 3. Lay each group of colourful mini-charm squares in 2 columns, as shown in pic.
- 4. Place a 1" square in opposite corners of the minicharm square. Check the diagonal lines slant the right way (see pic).
- The lines in the left hand column slant
- The lines in the right hand column slant
- Pin the 1" squares in place.

# Now, over to the sewing machine...

5. Using a small stitch length (2 to 2.2) sew along each diagonal line.

6. To piece the corner squares quickly use the "chain piece" technique, sewing the upper corner square of all 24 units, one after the other, without cutting the thread.





- 7. Once all upper corner squares have been sewn, fold over white corner triangle and press to lock stitches. Cut thread to separate squares.
- 8. Repeat steps 5 to 7 for the lower corner squares.



Optional: Trim excess corner fabric, leaving 2 ½" seam, press seam open.



Now we're ready to join the squares to form the little ears of wheat..

 Using ¼" seam sew adjoining squares together, to form units (see pic).

10. Sew the units together to form 3 columns, each of 4 units. TIP: Match seams, and hold in place using pins placed approx. 1cm either side of seam.



#### 11. Press seams

Next, lay the 3 columns side by side. Now we're ready to add the background patches. (see pic below)

Using the lighter 2 ½" squares reserved from the mini-charm and the low volume strip.


- 12 Place 4 squares between the ears of wheat.
- 13 Cut 24 squares in half and place around the edges of the panel, to form a narrow border.



14. Using ¼" seams sew together the background squares and rectangles...

- Attach the rectangles above and below the ears of wheat.(pic 1.)
- Next attach the sashing squares separating the ears of wheat, and trim  $\frac{1}{4}$ " inch off the sashing.(pic 2)
- Join the 3 ears of wheat and sashing, finally sewing the side sashing to left and right edges.(pic. 3)







Your Harvest Home panel is now complete!


## To make the pillow, cut the Essex linen Fat Quarter 25" x 20":

### To make an outer border:

- (2) 2 1/4" x 10 1/2" strips z
- $(2) 2'' \times 21'' \text{ strips } v$

## And 2 pieces for the backing:

- (1) 14 ¼" x 13 ½" x
- (1) 11" x 13 ½"- y



- Sew the linen borders (z and v) either side, and above and below the pieced block. Press seams flat.
- Layer the quilt block, wadding and plain cotton, to form a quilt sandwich. Quilt as desired. In the block shown in this tutorial, stitch in the ditch emphasizes the ears of wheat. Pic below shows quilting on reverse of block.



## Backing and binding.

- Place the 2 pieces of backing linen so one overlaps the others, where the pillow will be inserted. Sew a double hem on the 2 overlapping edges.
- Place the backing pieces on the reverse of the block, wrong side down with hemmed edges in middle. Sew ¼" around the edges.
- Fold the 2 ½" binding strips in half lengthwise, wrong side together, and press.
- Bind raw edges.





Your pillow is now complete! Time now to sit back, enjoy a cuppa, and the little wonders of autumn.
